I have grown up with the conference essentially, being a kid in 1998, a student (2006–2009), a junior alumni (2012–2014), a member of the Senior Alumni Committee (since 2020) and now the co-host of the conference. We can't wait for you to experience everything we've been working on but we can't wait to see what you all have prepared too! In Ireland, we say "Níl aon tinteán mar do thinteán féin" (There's no place like home) and I look forward to sharing my home with you all as part of CEI 2021.

CONFERENCE PLATFORMS

1. **ZOOM**

The main conference platform will be Zoom. To download and use Zoom please follow these instructions: https://zoom.us/download

The Zoom call details will be sent out 2 weeks before the conference to all registered delegations.

Most parts of the conference will take place in the "Zoom main room" where all conference participants will be on a regular Zoom call but with their microphones switched off.

Some sessions will require you to navigate to the correct breakout room (see the next section).

We ask that all participants take responsibility for their own display name.


All students and participants under 18 MUST have the following: Name – Country e.g. Sam – Sweden. No family/surnames are allowed.

Any inappropriate or unreadable display names will be removed by the hosting team.



2. USING ZOOM & ZOOM BREAKOUT ROOMS

- 1 Click here to turn on/off your microphone
- Click here to turn on/off your camera
- You can see who else is on the call. If you want to **change your own name** in Zoom, click on participants. Beside your name, there will be the option "rename". Enter your name (see our rules) and click okay.
- Click here to view the **chat**. Use the chat to ask questions and interact with other participants.
- Often you will need to go to a certain **Breakout Room** (e.g. for your Clan group or Workshop).
 Click here and then click on the Room you are meant to be in.
- Click here to use the Zoom **reactions**. You can choose e.g. to do 'thumbs up' or 'clap' for a speaker or fellow participants.
- Clicking here means you leave the call. If you want to re-join, you might have to login again

3. WONDER.ME – POSTER EXHIBITION AND FINAL PARTY





KEYNOTE: MARY ROBINSON

SPEAKER: Mary Robinson

DESCRIPTION: Mary Robinson (1944) was the first female president of the

Republic of Ireland, serving in office from 1990 to 1997. Thereafter she took up the position of United Nations (UN) High Commissioner for Human Rights, a position she held from 1997 to 2002. In 2010 the Mary Robinson Foundation — Climate Justice was set up, an organization dedicated to be 'a centre for thought leadership, education and advocacy on the struggle to secure global justice for those many victims of climate change who are usually forgotten — the poor, the disempowered and the marginalised across the world.' In 2007, she was a founding member of The Elders, the group of independent



global leaders founded by Nelson Mandela who work for peace, justice and human rights. She is now chair of the Elders. Mary Robinson is currently professor of climate justice in Dublin. Mary Robinson will share her thoughts about the role and power of youths in the fight against climate change and her experiences with connecting local stories and communities with global movements and discussions. We're excited and honoured to have this high profile speaker join us!

discipline. This workshop will start with a brief recap of what citizen science is and the way it has been used in classrooms and fieldtrips for decades, highlights of technological advances like smart phone with camera and GPS which have

opened up a platter of new opportunities for citizen science. Then a brief look at challenges which practitioners and educators should be aware of and European Marine Board ten good practice principles as one of the supports available to those planning citizen science. This will be followed by two 10 minute case study presentations. The first by Dave Wall of the National Biodiversity Data Centre on recording biota around us and sending the findings for validation and inclusion in biodiversity data sets which can then be available for multiple uses. The second case study sets out examples of citizen science applied to participate directly in environmental protection and management. This includes use in environmental audit of an area as precursor to improvements of say school ground biodiversity, identification of problem hotspots of say marine litter or setting volunteer citizen science findings into legal context, like nitrate pollution and helping



or instigating action to improve matters. Introduction and Case Study 2: Karin Dubsky international Coordinator Coastwatch. Karin Dubsky BA, MSc is an estuarine ecologist, university staff in Trinity College Dublin and Director of Coastwatch. As active environmentalist with over 3 decades of experience in citizen science she sees informed local community involvement in coastal planning and protection as essential. Later Karin cofounded Coastwatch Europe as a network of research, education and environment groups using citizen science to support informed public participation in environmental protection and management.



instigated a legal case known as Climate Case Ireland, which ended in the Supreme Court of Ireland in 2020 with the Supreme Court quashing the Irish government's inadequate climate mitigation plan. This made

Climate Case Ireland only the second case in the world to successfully challenge a government's overall

mitigation ambition. The Supreme Court's judgment was variously described as "a watershed moment", "seismic", and "a turning-point for climate governance in Ireland". The workshop will discuss the experience of litigating Climate Case Ireland, how strategic litigation can help to address climate breakdown, and how the public campaign in support of the case helped to strengthen and diversify Ireland's climate movement.


